1. 50th IEA Council Meeting

I am pleased to inform all members of our extremely successful Council meeting held on the 9th & 10th August in Reykjavik, Iceland. This meeting was hosted by the Nordic Ergonomics Society to whom we offer our heartfelt thanks.

Their President, Torunn Sveinsdottir and the NES Board offered the Council excellent hospitality and we are very grateful for their support.

This was the 50th Council meeting of the IEA and a special lapel pin was provided by the IEA to all attendees. I will bring these to Beijing next year to continue our small way of personalization with the IEA.

2. New Members Approved to Join the IEA

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4. Remember: November 15th 2008 – Deadline for the IEA'2009 Congress

This will be the last date that you can submit an Abstract or proposal for the IEA2009 Congress in Beijing, China. The online submission will be live at the end of August. You can select which Technical track you would like to be involved among the 40 Tracks listed. You will be asked to indicate the Primary AND Secondary Tracks so that your submission will be appropriately classified. We also encourage joint sessions with several tracks. You may submit an abstract/proposal to the following categories:

- Symposia
- Invited symposium
- Joint track symposium
- Panel
- Workshop
- Demonstration
- 99 seconds proposal
- Poster

5. Update on IEA2009 – Countdown: 11 months to go!

Promotion for the Congress. A pdf of the Congress flyer is now available on the home page of the IEA website at www.iea.cc Please distribute this flyer at your local conferences and any opportunities you can to promote participation in the Congress.

Technical program for the Congress is now under framework development by the Scientific Program Chair, Kan Zhang from CES and Co-Chair, Halimahtun Khalid, IEA STP Chair. The major framework is based on the 25 IEA Technical Committees (TC) that have proposed their TC Tracks within the scientific program. However, due to interests expressed by participants in areas of the ergonomics domain, there are also a growing number of other Tracks not covered by a TC. The IEA is indeed grateful for their initiatives and effort to organize several sessions within their tracks.

Keynote speakers. Besides the opening keynotes by the IEA President, David Caple, and Congress Host, Kan Zhang, there will be 11 other keynote addresses offered by invited speakers, on a wide range of topics, reflecting diversity of interests. Check this out at www.iea2009.org

Events. As part of the IEA “partnership and inclusiveness” mission, several events have been organized. Check the Congress website for the full list of events. Below are new events that require your participation:

- **IEA Triennial Forum** – this is an IEA outreach session involving the Standing Committees and Technical Committees of the IEA. It will be held during lunch on the first day of the Congress. We encourage you to meet members of these committees, to explore their work and to join their TCs.
- **Student-to-Student Outreach** – this is a student get-together event, to be organized by students, for all students participating in the Congress. We encourage you to contact Jan Dul and Thomas Smith if you wish to offer student names to help with the planning and organization of this event.

- **Meet-the-Editors Panel** – this session is open to all IEA Endorsed journals. Publishers/Editors of the 13 endorsed journals are invited to participate in the panel by describing the journal and its scope of article coverage. It provides an opportunity for the IEA community to know where their work may be published.
- **ISO/TC 159/SC 4 Meeting** - a meeting of this standards committee will be held in co-location with the IEA 2009 Congress. You can observe how the meeting is conducted over the 1.5 days. If you have questions, contact Ralph Bruder who will liaise with the convener of the meeting, Tom Stewart.

7. Liberty Mutual Research Medal Announced

We are pleased to announce the 2008 winners of the Liberty Mutual Medal for the best research in the area of OHS submitted to the IEA judging panel. The paper selected was “Digging Deeper: An investigation into OHS in the New South Wales mining industry” by Shaw, A. et al. from Australia. A co-author, Verna Blewett was present at the Council meeting as one of the Australian delegates when Pierre Falzon made the announcement. This was a wonderful surprise. Under the new arrangements between the IEA and Ian Noy from Liberty Mutual an annual prize of US\$10,000 is provided by Liberty Mutual to the winning authors. This is the most valuable and prestigious prize for research in the ergonomics domain.

Discuss this now with your members who may consider applying in early 2009 for this award.

10. Cyberg 2008 conference



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Attachment : IEA 2009 Congress Submission Guidelines

SELECTING YOUR PRESENTATION TYPE

The submission process requires that you select a presentation type that best fits the abstract/proposal you are submitting. All Congress sessions are 90 minutes in duration except for Joint Track sessions which may be 2 hours, and Workshops, which may be 3 or 6 hours.

At this stage, only [Abstracts](#) (500 words) should be submitted, using the given [template](#). For certain presentation type (panel, workshop and 99 seconds) specific information about the presenter/facilitator is also required.

Symposia: An individual submits an [abstract](#) for oral presentation in a specific Track. Abstracts of similar focus for the Track are gathered in one session. Oral presentation of each paper is about 15 minutes with question-answer period following each paper in the session, or after the final paper.

Invited Symposium: A Track Chair/Co-Chair within a specific Track invites up to five presenters to give individual oral presentations (15 minutes). The session concludes with question-answer segment and/or discussant presentation. **The Chair/Co-Chair submits all [abstracts](#) for the Track session.**

Joint Track Symposium: Two or more Track Chairs organize sessions with up to 8 presenters to give individual oral presentations (15-20 minutes). The session concludes with a joint discussion. **The Track Chairs submit all [abstracts](#) for the Joint Track session.**

Panel: Each panelist gives a brief statement (5-10 minutes) followed by extended discussion involving the audience and panel members. Maximum of six panelists with minimum of 30 minutes discussion time. An organizer or Chair submits a 1-2 page (A4) [proposal](#) to include a description of the topic, names of the panelists and a short description of their expertise.

Poster: Presenter(s) display materials on a board for 90 minutes in graphical format. Emphasis is on one-on-one interaction with the audience. The presenter submits an [abstract](#).

Demonstration: Presenter gives a brief oral presentation (5 minutes) followed by a live demonstration of a product or tool. A session may include up to five demonstrations. Audience members circulate throughout the room, and a demo presenter may repeat the presentation numerous times. No commercialism is permitted. The 1-2 page [proposal](#) to include a description of the product or tool and details of the demonstrator.

Workshop: Organizer combines educational lecture and active hands-on exercises to promote skill-building of a method, technique, or tool. Emphasis is on specific, practical skills associated with the exercises. The workshop may be 3 or 6 hours; one or more presenters as needed to address audience needs. An honorarium is paid to the presenter(s). The 2-3 page [proposal](#) to outline the topic, learning objectives and expected outcome, target audience, method of instruction, organizer biodata, and workshop duration.

99 seconds: A facilitator guides and facilitates an open discussion of topic in a track area that is of public interest. The facilitator invites the audience to discuss the topic for 99 seconds per person. Emphasis is on peer sharing and

no formal presentation is required. The facilitator submits a 1 page proposal that outlines the issues for discussion, together with a brief biodata.

CHOOSING THE APPROPRIATE TRACK

The IEA 2009 Congress promotes 40 TRACKS concerned with the human factors/ergonomics aspects of specific application areas. Some Tracks are organized by the IEA Technical Committees, www.iea.cc. Others are organized by interest groups within the IEA community at large.

When uploading your proposal, you will need to select one of these Tracks. The form also requires you to indicate your PRIMARY Track and SECONDARY Track for scheduling purposes.

RE: Global Ergonomics Month - October 2008

The IEA Council meeting in Iceland agreed for all Federated Societies to consider one or more activities during October to "outreach" and promote ergonomics to the community.

I seek your support for this activity in a way that is meaningful for your Society and community.

I include the suggestions provided to the IEA Development Committee Chair, Jan Dul, from Federated Societies who have already done this in past years. Detail of which Society has tried the action is also provided if you wish to communicate with them directly. These details are on the IEA website in the Members only section - http://www.iea.cc/browse.php?contID=BPI_Improve_Visibility_thread

In general, the public at large has a limited notion what the field of ergonomics encompasses. This can be improved by enlarging public visibility and recognition.

How to support researchers and practitioners for their public visibility?

- Work with local science museums and other business related professional organizations. (HFES)
- Develop school visitation packages. (HFES)
- Support members in writing articles on ergonomic success stories, particularly for the specialist press. (ES)
- Organize seminars with invited speakers and try to get media attention. (NES)
- Create relationship with the mass media, e.g. by establishing an outreach committee focusing on media and press writers and producers. (HFES, SIE)

How to receive recognition by national authorities or national pressure groups?


- Be involved in actions which have public appeal, such as reducing MSD and other concerns which are very popular in the country. (ABERGO)
- Develop media statements and processes to quickly respond to HFE related at the national level driven by lobbyists and others. (HFES)

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- Be active in standardization work, e.g. establish a standards committee, answer enquiries regarding proposed standards. (NES) These are some suggestions for each federated Society to consider in October 2008 as a contribution to Global Ergonomics month.
