

IEA Endorsed Certification systems for Professional Ergonomists

Ergonomists who have been certified by the following certification boards at the highest level have been peer-reviewed to ensure that they have obtained an education in ergonomics at university level that largely covers all of the IEA core competencies (generally Master Degree level). Additionally they have at least two years of independent professional experience. The requirements of some certification boards exceed the minimum IEA requirements in terms of experience. These ergonomists have signed a Code of Conduct and are regularly reviewed to ensure that they remain up-to-date in professional knowledge.
